At Blaze, we are always seeking opportunities to fulfill our Core Purpose of creating Better Lives for our members. One of the significant ways we do this is through our Core Action to Give Back, which allows us to make a meaningful difference in the communities we serve. I am proud to share a powerful recent example of this impact.

Blaze has teamed up with the Federal Home Loan Bank (FHLB) Des Moines to distribute a total of \$1 Million in donations to 33 Minnesota nonprofits. These funds will support vital work in affordable housing and community development.

This opportunity for Blaze partners was made possible through the FHLB Des Moines Member Impact Fund, which matched up to \$3 for every \$1 Blaze donated to the recipient nonprofits. Funds are designated to support the capacity-building or working capital necessary for these organizations to strengthen their ability to serve affordable housing or community development needs in Minnesota communities.

The recipient organizations are each longtime Blaze partners, working to improve lives and strengthen communities across the state. These grants will support projects ranging from housing support for veterans to library renovations, and everything in between.

Life is about giving, and that's what this partnership with the FHLB Des Moines has allowed us to do. \$1 Million is going to make an incredible impact in our communities, and we are so excited to lean into our Core Action to Give Back in this way.

Protecting Your Online Accounts: Password Safety Tips

Your passwords are the digital keys to your personal and professional life—just like the keys to your home, they must be kept secure. Reusing or choosing weak passwords is comparable to leaving your house key in a public place with your address attached.

In today's digital world, the average person manages dozens of online accounts, making password management a challenge. Compounding this issue, cybercriminals often target stolen usernames and passwords from data breaches to gain unauthorized access to sensitive information.

Follow these best practices to strengthen your password security:

- **Use strong passwords.** Create passwords that are at least 12 characters long.
- Keep them unique. Never reuse passwords across different accounts.
- Opt for complexity. Use random characters or consider secure passphrases.
- **Use a password manager.** Choose a reputable password manager to securely store your credentials—protected by a strong master password.

Did You Know? Shared Branching



Did you know your credit union goes wherever you go? Thanks to Shared Branching, you can access your account at thousands of participating credit union locations across the country, just like you would at a Blaze branch.

What is Shared Branching?

Shared Branching is a national cooperative network that allows members of participating credit unions, like Blaze, to conduct a range of transactions at other credit union branches within the network. This expanded network makes it even easier for you to access your accounts, no matter where the road of life takes you.

What Can I Do at a Shared Branch?

Make deposits, withdrawals, loan payments, and transfers between your accounts. Cash advances, money orders, travelers checks, and official checks may also be available. To make sure the service you need is offered, you can contact the credit union you plan to visit for more information. To find a Shared Branch location near you, visit co-opcreditunions.org/locator.

How Do I Use a Shared Branch?

To access your account at a shared branch, let the representative know you are a Blaze member. For locations in Minnesota, you will need to provide your member number and a valid government-issued photo ID. When using a location outside Minnesota, you will be asked to provide a verification code from IDCheck.

What is IDCheck?

IDCheck is a new tool designed to enhance security and streamline identity verification for Shared Branching transactions. It helps participating credit unions validate guest members' identities and reduce the risk of potential fraud. To set up your IDCheck Verification, visit verify.coop.org. To complete the process and receive your code, you will need your member number, the last four digits of your Social Security Number, a photo of the front and back of your government-issued photo ID, and a selfie for identity verification. This information will be stored securely for future transactions.



Funds Availability Policy Changes

Due to regulatory changes, beginning on July 1, 2025, we are increasing the amount we make available for withdrawal from checks deposited not subject to the next day availability from \$225 to \$275. In addition, the amount available for withdrawal on exception holds for large deposits, increases from \$5,525 to \$6,725.
